James and his wife Claire live at Doddington Hall in Lincolnshire, a late Elizabethan house by Robert Smythson. Since taking over Doddington in 2006 it has been their much-loved family home. They have continued Claire's parents' work in devoting themselves to the upkeep, repair and progression of the Doddington Estate including: the development of the Farm Shop, Bike Shop, Café, Restaurant, Coffee Shop, Home Store, Farrow & Ball, Country Clothing Store, Bauble Barn, Christmas Tree Sales and Weddings and Events businesses; increasing public access; organising concerts and exhibitions and the development of various accommodation across the estate. Employment on the estate has grown from 20 to over 100. James had previously worked in finance and Claire in advertising.

DR LOYD GROSSMAN CBE FSA

CHAIRMAN OF THE HERITAGE ALLIANCE

Loyd Grossman CBE is an entrepreneur, writer and broadcaster with a long involvement in museums and heritage. He is Chairman of the Royal Parks, Chairman of the Heritage Alliance and President of The Arts Society (formerly NADFAS). Loyd was born in Boston and educated at Boston University, the London School of Economics and Magdalene College, Cambridge. A former Deputy Chairman of the Royal Drawing School, Commissioner of English Heritage and of the Museums and Galleries Commission, he is an Emeritus Governor of the LSE, a member of the Council of the British School at Rome and a member of the board of the Association of Leading Visitor Attractions. Loyd is Master of the Worshipful Company of Arts Scholars, a Liveryman of the Carpenters' Company and an Honorary Liveryman of the Glaziers' Company. He is a Governor of Compton Verney, a Fellow of the Royal Historical Society and of the Society of Antiquaries, and plays lead guitar in a rock band who have made seven appearances at Glastonbury.

JULIE KENNY CBE DL

CHAIR OF WENTWORTH WOODHOUSE PRESERVATION TRUST

Julie Kenny is a successful South Yorkshire based entrepreneur. Following the sale in 2016 of award winning Pyronix Limited which she built from start up in 1986, Julie continues her involvement in serving business and local communities and currently holds several trustee/patron positions for diverse charitable organisations. Julie is a Commissioner at Rotherham Council; Chair of Maltby Learning Trust; a director of Sheffield City Region LEP; Non-Executive Director with Robson Handling Technology and Non-Executive Chair of UK Commission for Employment and Skills which ceased trading on 31.03.2017 and is currently undergoing closure process for Government. Julie Chairs the Wentworth Woodhouse Preservation Trust which has recently acquired Wentworth Woodhouse from private owners. The Trust is committed to securing a long term sustainable future for the buildings, grounds and statuary associated with Wentworth Woodhouse and a programme of extensive works will commence in 2017. Julie's CBE and Honorary Doctorate from Sheffield Hallam University were conferred in recognition of her contribution to business in the region. Julie has served as a Deputy Lieutenant for South Yorkshire since 2005 and was honoured to be the High Sheriff of South Yorkshire 2012/13. Julie was the Vitalise Businesswoman of the Year in 2013 and Private Businesswoman of the Year 2014. Julie had a successful career as a litigation lawyer in both local authority and private practice before changing direction and founding Pyronix. Julie has 3 grown-up children.

JONATHAN RUFFER

CHAIRMAN OF AUCKLAND CASTLE TRUST, ELEVEN ARCHES AND RUFFER LLP

For more than 900 years Auckland Castle, Bishop Auckland, served as a private palace for England's only Prince-Bishop. It remains one of the most important and best-preserved medieval bishops' palaces in all Europe and stands at the centre of a wider sacred Christian landscape, believed to date back around 1500 years. In 2012, Jonathan Ruffer purchased the Grade I listed palace in County Durham and established Auckland Castle Trust, to keep it in trust for the people of the North East. The Castle is now at the heart of the charity's £70m plans to create an arts, faith and heritage destination of international significance and revitalise the town in which it stands. Jonathan, who grew up in North Yorkshire, and originally trained as a barrister, is Chairman of Auckland Castle Trust, as well as its sister charity, Eleven Arches, and city-based investment company, Ruffer LLP.
