Disposal of waste

Emergencies

- 2 operative's response to situations in accordance with organisational authorisation and personal skills when involved with

 - 2.2 emergencies relating to occupational activities

Fire extinguishers

3 water, CO₂, foam, powder and their uses

Hazards

4 those identified by risk assessment, method of work, manufacturers' technical information, statutory regulations and official guidance

Health and safety control equipment

- 5 identified by the principles of protection for occupational use, types and purpose of each type, work situations and general work environment
 - 5.1 collective protective measures
 - 5.2 personal protective equipment (PPE)
 - 5.3 respiratory protective equipment (RPE)
 - 5.4 local exhaust ventilation (LEV)

Information

6 drawings, specifications, schedules, method statements, risk assessments, manufacturers' information and current regulations governing buildings and associated with historical conservation and the preparation of thatching materials

Legislation and official guidance

7 this relates to the operative's responsibilities regarding potential accidents and health hazards whilst working in the workplace, at height, in confined spaces, with tools and equipment, with materials and substances, with movement/storage of materials and by manual handling and mechanical lifting

Maintenance

8 operative care of hand tools and/or portable power tools and ancillary equipment

Methods of work

9	application of knowledge for safe and healthy work practices, procedures
	and skills relating to the method/area of work and materials used to:

- 9.1 recognise thatch materials
- 9.2 prepare for use, cereal straw (long straw, combed wheat reed), water reed, sedge grass, heather, marram, bent, bracken, rush, flax, turf or alternative specialist materials
- 9.3 produce yealms, bunches, bundles, nitches and wads
- 9.4 make spars, sways and liggers
- 9.5 make dollies or ridge rolls and straw bonds
- 9.6 gather/harvest thatching material
- 9.7 work on buildings of historical significance
- 9.8 use hand tools, portable power tools and equipment
- 9.9 work at height
- 9.10 use access equipment
- 10 team work and communication
- 11 needs of other occupations associated with thatching

Problems

- 12 those arising from information, resources and methods of work
 - 12.1 own authority to rectify
 - 12.2 organisational reporting procedures

Programme

- 13 types of progress charts, timetables and estimated times
- 14 organisational procedures for reporting circumstances which will affect the work programme

Protect work

15 protect work against damage from general workplace activities, other occupations and adverse weather conditions

Resources

- 16 materials, components and equipment relating to types, quantity, quality, sizes and the sustainability of standard and/or specialist:
 - 16.1 cereal straw, water reed, sedge grass, heather, marram, bent, bracken, rush, flax and turf (other suitable material)
 - 16.2 coppice materials (spars, sways and liggers)
 - 16.3 hand and/or portable powered tools and equipment
